15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Ramthakur College shall focus on overall quality development of students. The college strongly promote and favour interdisciplinary courses. As the college is affiliated to Tripura Central University, we follow the course structure designed by the university. Here students of Economics honours can study Mathematics as an elective subject. Teachers of the department of Mathematics take classes of the students of

Commerce for the courses Business Mathematics and Business Statistics. Teachers of the department of Information Technology take classes of the students of Physical Science for the courses C-Programming and Basic Programming. NEP-2020 will be adopted very soon and we will have more scope to introduce multidisciplinary courses.

The University has made it compulsory to study Foundation Courses in their regular curriculum irrespective of their stream. Important days like International Yoga Day, International Women's Day, Environment Day, Road Awareness Programmes are to be celebrated and observed bringing together all the disciplines of the college.

As this college is affiliated to Tripura University (A Central University), it follows the guidelines laid down by the University. We will adopt the NEP proposal to provide flexible Education and take measures to initiate the process of ABC (Academic Bank of Credits). ABC ID is already assigned to each individual students of the college.

Our motto is to create a center of excellence by training and empowering our young minds. Our College takes efforts for the skill development of the students. Our College works for skill development through various webinars/seminars/workshops and by organizing various competitions. With the view to enhancing employability skills, Soft Study Courses like Entrepreneurship Development, Human Resource Development and Studies, Journalism, Data Analysis, E-Communication, E-Marketing are included in the curriculum. We have already taken initiative to start a batch under Skill India Mission (Sector Name: Beauty & Wellness, Job Role: Yoga Instructor (B&W)).

Pledges, Celebration of National Days like Independence Day, Yoga Day, Constitution Day, AIDS Day, Human Rights Day, Republic Day are celebrated to develop a spirit of citizenship and human values.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Ramthakur College is affiliated with Tripura University, a central university, and follows the curriculum as set by the university. The program is divided into a three-year degree program and a three-year honors degree program. The college aims to instill the highest intellectual standards through academic commitments. To ensure that the university curriculum is followed, the college's academic calendar is prepared with the active involvement of all faculties. Each department formulates its own action plan and teaching methods to give the best education to students. Extra classes and tutorials are also taken to enhance the knowledge of students. The curriculum is delivered through lectures and study materials, and classes are made more interactive through the use of powerpoint presentations, quizzes, debates, group discussions, and paper presentations. Educational tours, field trips, and interdisciplinary competitions are organized by the college, where teachers and students can present papers. Sessional tests

are conducted in accordance with the academic calendar. Each department periodically reviews the syllabus and students' progress through departmental meetings. The faculties encourage and equip students to participate in competitions outside the campus. Departmental wall magazines are also prepared by students to showcase their talents. Feedback from students is regularly collected to improve future curriculum development.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The college follows academic calendar for conducting continuous internal evaluations. This calendar includes important information such as the start dates of exams, schedules for internal exams, and dates for term-end exams. Teachers plan their curriculum by distributing the syllabus according to the academic calendar.

Annually, the college conducts sessional exams before university exams. The first sessional exam for the summer session for 2nd, 4th, and 6th semester students is held in March, while the second sessional exam is conducted in April. Science students also have practical exams for the second sessional. For 1st, 3rd, and 5th semester students, the first sessional exam is held in September, and the second sessional exam is conducted in November. Science students also have practical exams for the third and fifth semesters.

To further enhance students' knowledge, the college conducts various assessments such as quizzes, group discussions, viva-voce, paper presentations, and assignments. After exams, teachers evaluate answer scripts and provide feedback to students. In some cases, re-examinations are also conducted to improve students' scores. The university conducts final exams for 2nd and 4th semester in June, while exams for 1st, 3rd, and 5th semester are held in December.

Final year students have a project work worth 100 marks, which are divided into two components - 20% for paper presentation and

80% for the preparation of the project. The project is guided by departmental teachers, who select the topics from the syllabus.

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The affiliated University's curriculum includes a variety of foundation courses that are mandatory for students in different

semesters and streams. These courses cover a range of subjects including Gender Studies, Environmental Science, Computer Studies, and Public Administration. In Environmental Studies, students gain an understanding of the ecology, natural resources, conservation, biodiversity, and management of the environment, as well as the impact of human population and social issues. Human rights and Gender Studies also play a crucial role in the curriculum, where students learn about the basic concepts of human rights, classification of rights, and humanitarian law, as well as the human rights movement in India and the role of the national human rights commission. Gender Studies also focuses on theoretical approaches from Liberals, Marxists, and Radical perspectives, as well as the rights of women and the representation of women in decision-making processes. Additionally, courses such as Society and Technology and Philosophy provide students with a deeper understanding of ethical theories and the impact of technology on society, while also delving into Indian and Western ethics. Through these foundation courses, students develop a scientific temperament, deepen their moral values, and become responsible and ethical citizens.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The college has a comprehensive approach to cater to the diverse learning needs of its students. The college has a structured mechanism to identify both slow learners and advanced learners. This year students having back paper in a particular course is considered as slow learners w.r.t that course and students securing more than 7 SGPA in a particular course is identified as advanced learners w.r.t that course. The list of such candidates are prepared centrally by Academic Committee and there after these are distributed department wise.

The classes, interactive sessions, and tests help teachers to identify the needs of each student. Slow learners are given extra attention and care through additional tutorial classes, interactive sessions, and ICT-enabled classes. Teachers also use WhatsApp groups to interact with students, which helps slow learners to clear their doubts and understand the lessons better.

On the other hand, advanced learners are constantly motivated and provided with opportunities to reach their full potential. Teachers provide regular interaction, suggestions, and advice to help advanced learners excel. They are also given opportunities to help their peers, particularly slow learners, in their studies. These sessions are closely monitored by teachers. Furthermore, advanced learners are given appropriate supplementary readings and encouraged to interact with their peers through group discussions and presentations.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The institution has created a student-centered learning environment that prioritizes the needs and growth of each individual student. Faculty members have implemented a variety of student-centric teaching methods in addition to traditional lectures.

For students studying humanities subjects, the college has a well-equipped language lab to improve communication skills. The Bengali and Hindi departments regularly organize theme-based quizzes, while the English and Bengali departments publish wall magazines. Short film production is also integrated into the curriculum to increase students' interest and knowledge in the field. Theatre workshops are also part of the learning experience.

In the science departments, students receive hands-on training in advanced tools and techniques, as well as vocational subjects such as organic farming, apiculture, and gardening. Departments like Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry also conduct case studies on environmental and agricultural topics. The college also encourages and provides opportunities for students to participate in on-the-job training at institutes such as Fishery College and College of Agriculture.

Under the cooperative learning system, students are divided into

small groups and encouraged to teach their peers in a particular subject area. This approach is based on the belief that 'to teach is to learn twice'. Student presentations and demonstrations of experiments, as well as industrial visits, contribute to an active and interactive learning atmosphere.

The College boasts a modern, technologically advanced campus that is fully equipped with Wi-Fi and internet facilities for both faculty and students. The College Library is partially automated and computerized, with all housekeeping operations being handled by computers. Additionally, the library is a member of NLIST (a program of INFLIBNET) and has developed its own WhatsApp group to interact with students and provide them with the resources they need. The library also has a Facebook page that provides current information and notices to the students. Overdue reminders are sent through e-mail, and the library also organizes orientation sessions to help students access the library resources more easily.

In addition to this, many classrooms are equipped with overhead projectors, which enable e-teaching and learning. The College also has a portable projector that can be used for film and documentary screenings. Furthermore, laptops are provided to departments, and advanced software like Mathematica 9.0 and SPSS 14.0 are used for various programs. The College encourages the use of open-source software for making projects and assignments, promoting the use of technology in education.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The college recognizes the significance of the internal assessment system in enhancing academic performance, as it plays a crucial role in the teaching and learning process. In compliance with university guidelines, internal assessments are conducted to judge writing skills (assignments), presentation skills (seminars), and knowledge levels (test papers). The college has an Examination Committee in place to oversee the internal assessment process, which is responsible for tasks such as collection, sorting, coding, and security of question papers. The dates of internal exams are announced on the college noticeboard and communicated to students via a WhatsApp group. Results are released within two weeks of the exam. The college conducts two exams centrally, one of which is an internal examination in the university examination pattern. Departments are given the autonomy to select appropriate methods of internal examination and evaluation, such as multiple-choice question tests and online assignments in Google Classroom, to bring

diversity to the assessment process.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The college has a comprehensive Grievance Redressal Mechanism in place, comprising of two levels: department, college. The responsibilities of department and college level coordinators are clearly defined and assigned. Strict invigilation is maintained, and any form of malpractice is not tolerated. Students who miss exams due to valid reasons are given the opportunity to re-appear. For course-end academic projects, internal marks are awarded based on punctuality, quality of data collected, and timely submission of the project.

At the department level, a committee is chaired by the Head of the department, with department teachers as members. The head in charge of the course distributes the valued answer scripts during class hours, and students can review their answer scripts in the presence of their teachers, ensuring transparency and reliability in the internal evaluation process. Students can also address grievances concerning internal assessment marks through their respective departments. Grievances are processed by the examiner and head of the department, and if necessary, the answer sheet is revalued by the faculty in the presence of the complainant. Any discrepancies in marks are corrected immediately.

If grievances are not resolved at the department level, they are brought to the college level committee, which is chaired by the Principal, and comprises the HOD of the concerned department and a senior teacher nominated by the College council as members.

Ramthakur College is a government degree college that operates under the jurisdiction of the Principal Secretary of Higher Education and the Director of Higher Education. The college administration is led by the Principal, who serves as the President of the Teachers' Council, which is made up of teachers appointed by the Council. The Teachers' Council is responsible for supporting the Principal and ensuring the smooth operation of the college, with the Principal acting as the President.

The college has various sub-committees, including the Examination Committee, Academic Committee, Discipline Committee, Development Committee, Lower Purchase Committee, among others. The Examination Committee conducts semester exams and internal sessional exams, while the Admission Committee handles college admissions. The Cultural subcommittee organizes cultural programs, and the Disciplinary Committee ensures student discipline. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

As a government degree college, Ramthakur College is under the purview of the Department of Higher Education of the Government of Tripura. Nevertheless, the college has implemented several internal strategies to ensure its efficient operation. For example, the Teaching and Learning Process is a well-structured strategy that the college has adopted. At the beginning of each academic year, the Academic Committee prepares the academic calendar and routine, and the Head of Department of each department develops a departmental routine and distributes the syllabus to the faculty members. This ensures that the syllabus is completed on time, and extra lessons, tutorials, and revision classes are taken as needed. Slow learners receive special attention, and study materials and previous year's question papers are provided.

Each department has its own departmental library where students can borrow books as reference materials. To supplement the students' learning experience, study tours and field visits are arranged by some departments. Each department is equipped with computers and internet facilities, and a mentor-mentee system is in place to guide the students. Continuous evaluation is conducted through assignments and sessional exams, and group learning is practiced in some departments. The main goal of each department is to enhance the students' knowledge and familiarize them with the modern education system. The college also provides library facilities and access to INFLIBNET to its students. Some departments conduct group discussions, quiz competitions, and debates to help students overcome their fears, expand their knowledge, and upgrade themselves.

The college is led by the Principal, who works closely with the Teachers' Council to maintain a positive and intellectually stimulating environment in the institution. Policy decisions are made by the Directorate of Higher Education and communicated to the college through the Officer on Special Duty. The Principal, supported by the Secretary, Teachers' Council, and various sub-committees, oversees the implementation of academic and administrative plans and policies. The college has various sub-committees, including an Academic committee, Admission Committee, Examination Committee, Social Entertainment Committee, Library Committee, and more, to ensure smooth operations.

The college has NCC and NSS wings, IQAC Cell, NAAC Cell, and RUSA Cell to enhance the students' learning experience. Assistant professors are appointed by the Tripura Public Service Commission (TPSC) and non-teaching staff are selected through interviews. Guest Lecturers are selected based on individual class basis, in accordance with UGC guidelines and Higher Education requirements. The cleaning support crew and Night Guard are provided by an outside firm.

The Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for regular faculty members is administered by the Directorate of Higher Education, in accordance with UGC guidelines. Non-teaching staff are promoted based on the Tripura government policy. All staff in the college are bound by the Tripura Civil Service (Conduct) Rules, 1988.

6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 - The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff

Ramthakur College, a government degree college, provides comprehensive welfare measures for its teaching and non-teaching staff. The salary and other monetary benefits for teaching staff, such as Assistant Professors and Associate Professors, are determined by the UGC's recommendations, while non-teaching staff follow the state pay commission's recommendations. The college offers an annual 3% increment for its staff, along with promotions and career advancement benefits in accordance with UGC and state government norms.

Faculty members who complete their Ph.D. degrees are rewarded with monetary incentives, and they are encouraged to attend professional development opportunities such as Orientation Programs, Refresher Courses, Seminars, and Workshops. Non-teaching staff are also provided training programs to enhance

their skills.

In addition, both teaching and non-teaching employees have access to various financial benefits such as the General Provident Fund, Gratuity Pension, and Group Life Insurance, as well as House Rent Allowance and Dearness Allowance. They are also provided with festival advance and loan without interest from the General Provident Fund.

For medical benefits, the Principal, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors receive medical reimbursement, while Group C and Group D employees receive a monthly medical allowance. Staff are also entitled to Casual Leave, Earn Leave, and Medical Leave, as well as Child Care Leave, Maternity Leave, and Paternity Leave. Moreover, all employees are eligible for three Bharat Darshan visits during their service tenure.

Instead, they are delegated to various training programs to expand their knowledge and potential in official matters. The Department of Higher Education regularly determines their advancement based on seniority. The performance appraisal process acts as a motivator for teachers to engage in research and expand their knowledge. This, in turn, benefits the organization as the teacher brings in new ideas, skills, and perspectives to the workplace. The performance appraisal system also helps organizations identify areas for improvement and make necessary changes to enhance the overall performance of employees.

In most cases, the Department of Higher Education initiates audits in colleges, where the department's audit cell follows the appropriate procedures. The audit may be conducted

by the Department of Audit or the Office of the Account General (AG).

The scope of the audit covers all financial transactions, purchases, and procurement, ensuring they comply with government financial regulations. This includes auditing of allowances such as HRA, medical, travel, and others. In addition, there is a mechanism for special audits, as required by the government. The AG is also invited to conduct audits as deemed necessary by the Department of Higher Education and the Government of Tripura's Finance Department.

The college is responsible for maintaining its cash books and stock registers in accordance with regulatory rules. The Accounts Section of the college handles the college's accounts and is checked and supervised regularly by the Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO). External financial audits are conducted by the Directorate of Audit, Government of Tripura, and the Accountant General (Audit Office), Tripura, Government of India. The last external financial audit was conducted on 22/08/2019 by the office of the Accountant General, Tripura.

Ramthakur College is affiliated with Tripura University, a central university, and follows the curriculum as set by the university. The program is divided into a three-year degree program and a three-year honors degree program. The college aims to instill the highest intellectual standards through academic commitments. To ensure that the university curriculum is followed, the college's academic calendar is prepared with the active involvement of all faculties. Each department formulates its own action plan and teaching methods to give the best education to students. Extra classes and tutorials are also taken to enhance the knowledge of students. The curriculum is delivered through lectures and study materials, and classes are made more interactive through the use of powerpoint presentations, quizzes, debates, group discussions, and paper presentations. Educational tours, field trips, and interdisciplinary competitions are organized by the college, where teachers and students can present papers. Sessional tests are conducted in accordance with the academic calendar. Each department periodically reviews the syllabus and students' progress through departmental meetings. The faculties encourage and equip students to participate in competitions outside the campus. Departmental wall magazines are also prepared by students to showcase their talents. Feedback from students is regularly collected to improve future curriculum development.

The college follows academic calendar for conducting continuous internal evaluations. This calendar includes

important information such as the start dates of exams, schedules for internal exams, and dates for term-end exams. Teachers plan their curriculum by distributing the syllabus according to the academic calendar.

Annually, the college conducts sessional exams before university exams. The first sessional exam for the summer session for 2nd, 4th, and 6th semester students is held in March, while the second sessional exam is conducted in April. Science students also have practical exams for the second sessional. For 1st, 3rd, and 5th semester students, the first sessional exam is held in September, and the second sessional exam is conducted in November. Science students also have practical exams for the third and fifth semesters.

To further enhance students' knowledge, the college conducts various assessments such as quizzes, group discussions, viva-voce, paper presentations, and assignments. After exams, teachers evaluate answer scripts and provide feedback to students. In some cases, re-examinations are also conducted to improve students' scores. The university conducts final exams for 2nd and 4th semester in June, while exams for 1st, 3rd, and 5th semester are held in December.

Final year students have a project work worth 100 marks, which are divided into two components - 20% for paper presentation and 80% for the preparation of the project. The project is guided by departmental teachers, who select the topics from the syllabus.

This year students having back paper in a particular course is considered as slow learners w.r.t that course and students securing more than 7 SGPA in a particular course is identified as advanced learners w.r.t that course. The list of such candidates are prepared centrally by Academic Committee and there after these are distributed department wise.</p> <p>The classes, interactive sessions, and tests help teachers to identify the needs of each student. Slow learners are given extra attention and care through additional tutorial classes, interactive sessions, and ICT-enabled classes. Teachers also use WhatsApp groups to interact with students, which helps slow learners to clear their doubts and understand the lessons better.</p>	

On the other hand, advanced learners are constantly motivated and provided with opportunities to reach their full potential. Teachers provide regular interaction, suggestions, and advice to help advanced learners excel. They are also given opportunities to help their peers, particularly slow learners, in their studies. These sessions are closely monitored by teachers. Furthermore, advanced learners are given appropriate supplementary readings and encouraged to interact with their peers through group discussions and presentations.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The institution has created a student-centered learning environment that prioritizes the needs and growth of each individual student. Faculty members have implemented a variety of student-centric teaching methods in addition to traditional lectures.

For students studying humanities subjects, the college has a well-equipped language lab to improve communication skills. The Bengali and Hindi departments regularly organize theme-based quizzes, while the English and Bengali departments publish wall magazines. Short film production is also integrated into the curriculum to increase students' interest

and knowledge in the field. Theatre workshops are also part of the learning experience.

In the science departments, students receive hands-on training in advanced tools and techniques, as well as vocational subjects such as organic farming, apiculture, and gardening. Departments like Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry also conduct case studies on environmental and agricultural topics. The college also encourages and provides opportunities for students to participate in on-the-job training at institutes such as Fishery College and College of Agriculture.

Under the cooperative learning system, students are divided into small groups and encouraged to teach their peers in a particular subject area. This approach is based on the belief that 'to teach is to learn twice'. Student presentations and demonstrations of experiments, as well as industrial visits, contribute to an active and interactive learning atmosphere.

The College boasts a modern, technologically advanced campus that is fully equipped with Wi-Fi and internet facilities for both faculty and students. The College Library is partially automated and computerized, with all housekeeping operations being handled by computers. Additionally, the library is a member of NLIST (a program of INFLIBNET) and has developed its own WhatsApp group to interact with students and provide them with the resources they need. The library also has a Facebook page that provides current information and notices to the students. Overdue reminders are sent through e-mail, and the library also organizes orientation sessions to help students access the library resources more easily.

In addition to this, many classrooms are equipped with

overhead projectors, which enable e-teaching and learning. The College also has a portable projector that can be used for film and documentary screenings. Furthermore, laptops are provided to departments, and advanced software like Mathematica 9.0 and SPSS 14.0 are used for various programs. The College encourages the use of open-source software for making projects and assignments, promoting the use of technology in education.

The college recognizes the significance of the internal assessment system in enhancing academic performance, as it plays a crucial role in the teaching and learning process. In compliance with university guidelines, internal assessments are conducted to judge writing skills (assignments), presentation skills (seminars), and knowledge levels (test papers). The college has an Examination Committee in place to oversee the internal assessment process, which is responsible for tasks such as collection, sorting, coding, and security of question papers. The dates of internal exams are announced on the college noticeboard and communicated to students via a WhatsApp group. Results are released within two weeks of the exam. The college conducts two exams centrally, one of which is an internal examination in the university examination pattern. Departments are given the autonomy to select appropriate methods of internal examination and evaluation, such as multiple-choice question tests and online assignments in Google Classroom, to bring diversity to the assessment process.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The college has a comprehensive Grievance Redressal Mechanism in place, comprising of two levels: department, college. The responsibilities of department and college level coordinators are clearly defined and assigned. Strict invigilation is maintained, and any form of malpractice is not tolerated. Students who miss exams due to valid reasons are given the opportunity to re-appear. For course-end academic projects, internal marks are awarded based on punctuality, quality of data collected, and timely submission of the project.

At the department level, a committee is chaired by the Head of the department, with department teachers as members. The head in charge of the course distributes the valued answer scripts during class hours, and students can review their answer scripts in the presence of their teachers, ensuring transparency and reliability in the internal evaluation process. Students can also address grievances concerning

internal assessment marks through their respective departments. Grievances are processed by the examiner and head of the department, and if necessary, the answer sheet is revalued by the faculty in the presence of the complainant. Any discrepancies in marks are corrected immediately.

If grievances are not resolved at the department level, they are brought to the college level committee, which is chaired by the Principal, and comprises the HOD of the concerned department and a senior teacher nominated by the College council as members.

Ramthakur College is a government degree college that operates under the jurisdiction of the Principal Secretary of Higher Education and the Director of Higher Education. The college administration is led by the Principal, who serves as the President of the Teachers' Council, which is made up of teachers appointed by the Council. The Teachers' Council is responsible for supporting the Principal and ensuring the smooth operation of the college, with the Principal acting as the President.

The college has various sub-committees, including the Examination Committee, Academic Committee, Discipline Committee, Development Committee, Lower Purchase Committee, among others. The Examination Committee conducts semester exams and internal sessional exams, while the Admission Committee handles college admissions. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/ perspective plan is effectively deployed

As a government degree college, Ramthakur College is under the purview of the Department of Higher Education of the Government of Tripura. Nevertheless, the college has implemented several internal strategies to ensure its efficient operation. For example, the Teaching and Learning Process is a well-structured strategy that the college has adopted. At the beginning of each academic year, the Academic Committee prepares the academic calendar and routine, and the Head of Department of each department develops a departmental routine and distributes the syllabus to the faculty members. This ensures that the syllabus is completed on time, and extra lessons, tutorials, and revision classes are taken as needed. Slow learners receive special attention, and study materials and previous year's question papers are provided.

Each department has its own departmental library where students can borrow books as reference materials. To supplement the students' learning experience, study tours and field visits are arranged by some departments. Each department is equipped with computers and internet facilities, and a mentor-mentee system is in place to guide the students. Continuous evaluation is conducted through assignments and sessional exams, and group learning is practiced in some departments. The main goal of each department is to enhance the students' knowledge and familiarize them with the modern education system. The college also provides library facilities and access to INFLIBNET to its students. Some departments conduct group discussions, quiz competitions, and debates to help students overcome their fears, expand their knowledge, and upgrade themselves.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The college is led by the Principal, who works closely with the Teachers' Council to maintain a positive and intellectually stimulating environment in the institution. Policy decisions are made by the Directorate of Higher Education and communicated to the college through the Officer on Special Duty. The Principal, supported by the Secretary, Teachers' Council, and various sub-committees, oversees the implementation of academic and administrative plans and policies. The college has various sub-committees, including an Academic committee, Admission Committee, Examination Committee, Social Entertainment Committee, Library Committee, and more, to ensure smooth operations.

The college has NCC and NSS wings, IQAC Cell, NAAC Cell, and RUSA Cell to enhance the students' learning experience. Assistant professors are appointed by the Tripura Public Service Commission (TPSC) and non-teaching staff are selected through interviews. Guest Lecturers are selected based on individual class basis, in accordance with UGC guidelines and Higher Education requirements. The cleaning support crew and Night Guard are provided by an outside firm.

The Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for regular faculty members is administered by the Directorate of Higher Education, in accordance with UGC guidelines. Non-teaching staff are promoted based on the Tripura government policy. All staff in the college are bound by the Tripura Civil Service (Conduct) Rules, 1988.

6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 - The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non- teaching staff

Ramthakur College, a government degree college, provides comprehensive welfare measures for its teaching and non-teaching staff. The salary and other monetary benefits for teaching staff, such as Assistant Professors and Associate Professors, are determined by the UGC's recommendations, while non-teaching staff follow the state pay commission's recommendations. The college offers an annual 3% increment for its staff, along with promotions and career advancement benefits in accordance with UGC and state government norms.

Faculty members who complete their Ph.D. degrees are rewarded with monetary incentives, and they are encouraged to attend professional development opportunities such as Orientation Programs, Refresher Courses, Seminars, and Workshops. Non-

teaching staff are also provided training programs to enhance their skills.

In addition, both teaching and non-teaching employees have access to various financial benefits such as the General Provident Fund, Gratuity Pension, and Group Life Insurance, as well as House Rent Allowance and Dearness Allowance. They are also provided with festival advance and loan without interest from the General Provident Fund.

For medical benefits, the Principal, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors receive medical reimbursement, while Group C and Group D employees receive a monthly medical allowance. Staff are also entitled to Casual Leave, Earn Leave, and Medical Leave, as well as Child Care Leave, Maternity Leave, and Paternity Leave. Moreover, all employees are eligible for three Bharat Darshan visits during their service tenure.

6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

The performance appraisal process is an essential component of employee evaluation in the education sector. It is a comprehensive technique that evaluates an employee's contribution to the organization and tracks their progress in their respective fields. The process helps to create accountability and motivation in the workplace, resulting in improved performance and satisfaction among employees.

Gazetted officials in the education sector receive an Annual Confidential Report (ACR) format, which they fill out as a self-appraisal. The report is then evaluated by the Principal and forwarded to the Directorate of Higher Education for further action. The ACR is used as the basis for determining career advancement and promotions for teaching personnel.

Non-teaching employees are not left behind, even though they do not receive a performance appraisal. Instead, they are delegated to various training programs to expand their knowledge and potential in official matters. Ramthakur College is a government institution, which makes it difficult for the college to conduct internal or external audits without authorization from the Director of Higher

Education. However, the Principal's office may request an audit if necessary. In most cases, the Department of Higher Education initiates audits in colleges, where the department's audit cell follows the appropriate procedures. The audit may be conducted by the Department of Audit or the Office of the Account General (AG).

The scope of the audit covers all financial transactions, purchases, and procurement, ensuring they comply with government financial regulations. This includes auditing of allowances such as HRA, medical, travel, and others. In addition, there is a mechanism for special audits, as required by the government. The AG is also invited to conduct audits as deemed necessary by the Department of Higher Education and the Government of Tripura's Finance Department.

The college is responsible for maintaining its cash books and stock registers in accordance with regulatory rules. The Accounts Section of the college handles the college's accounts and is checked and supervised regularly by the Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO). External financial audits are conducted by the Directorate of Audit, Government of Tripura, and the Accountant General (Audit Office), Tripura, Government of India. The last external financial audit was conducted on 22/08/2019 by the office of the Accountant General, Tripura.
