The College is affiliated to the Tripura University and follows the Syllabi designed by the University. Yes, syllabus upgradation is regularly done by the University at an interval of 5 years.

- In the year, a major modification, from TDC/TDCH (1+1+1) Annual System to Credit Based Six-Semester Degree Programmes has been taken up. Revision/update in the structure of syllabi for all UG level (Regular) programmes/courses has been introduced as per Tripura University Rules and Regulations from the session 2014-15 with following components:
 - (i) Compulsory (Foundation) Courses
 - (ii) Honours Courses
 - (iii) Core (Elective) Courses
 - (iv) Soft Study Courses
- Internal evaluation (20% marks) based on two sessional examinations and seminar/group discussions has been taken up.
- The question papers shall be set only in English (other than language subjects) both for Honours and General courses.
- A Project paper of 100 marks in the End Semester has been taken up.







6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The College follows the curriculum guidelines of Tripura University. Details are given below:

In the year, a major modification, from TDC/TDCH (1+1+1) Annual System to Credit Based Six-Semester Degree Programme has been taken up. Revision/update in the structure of syllabi for all UG level (Regular) programmes/courses has been introduced as per Tripura University Rules and Regulations. The exercise involved a major restructuring of the courses including compulsory and optional courses. The revision was initiated after the discussions and meetings with Department of Higher Education, Faculty Member representatives, Principals, Students Units.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Each faculty in the Department designs the teaching-learning style of their respective courses. Strategies commonly used for teaching-learning in the Department include the following:

- Effective implementation of teaching-learning plan for classwise syllabus distribution; student-centric learning through interactions with students and faculty members, group learning, tutorials, assignments encouraged to improve the teaching-learning process.
- Internal Assessment and ICT enabled learning have introduced for all students.
- Study tour is conducted by the Bio-logical Science Departments to enhance learning process. Power Point presentations in some Departments are also carried out.
- Encouraging and facilitating students in participating subject related competition, essay writing etc., exposure to write in wall magazine.
- Project-based learning is carried out by all science departments.
- Faculty members are deputed to ASCs of different Universities to enrich their

knowledge through participation in Orientation Programme/ Refresher Course/ shortterm training/ workshop.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Following examination and evaluation reforms have been introduced in the year as per Tripura University guidelines:

- From (1+1+1) Annual Examination System to Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) with 6 Semesters for all UG level programmes has been introduced in this period.
- Internal Assessment has been introduced in this period as per Tripura University guidelines. 20% of the total marks is allotted for Internal Assessments.
- In Regular Courses, MCQ pattern with use of OMR sheet in TDP (General) has been introduced. However, courses with practical component are exempted from MCQ pattern.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Provided infrastructural support such as library and laboratory, space for carrying out research work etc. Computer facility is provided in different segments of the College.
- Institutional support from the College authority is provided for smooth progress of research projects: autonomy to Principal Investigator for running the research projects, release of funds to the Principal Investigator as per instructions of funding agency. Computer facility is provided in different segments of the College.
- Teachers are encouraged to apply for research grant.
- On duty leave granted to the faculty members for attending professional Seminars, Conferences, and Workshops etc.
- Teachers are encouraged to take part in workshops/ seminars/ conferences and also motivated for research publications. During the year, 15 research papers were published in the peer-reviewed national/ international journals by the faculty. 17 books and articles in edited books were also published by the faculty.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

 The College has a separate building for library. Issuing library cards within 7 days of new admission. Procurement is done as per requirement and availability of funds. The College has a plan for digitisation of the library books.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- For the management of the students' affair, the College has a Students' Union which is elected annually as per the Department of Higher Education of State Government directives.
- For overall management, the College has a Core Committee as well as IQAC monitors the aspects in the academic and administrative arena. The College has a Teachers' Council with different academic as well as administrative sub-committees coordinates curricular, co-curricular and extension activities. Find people with strong cocurricular/ extra-curricular skills and encourage them to organise sports/ social cultural

events etc. Identify people with leadership skills and groom them with administrative responsibilities.

- UGC pay scale, annual increment and promotion to teachers, advance increment for M.Phil./ Ph.D. are followed as per UGC norms following the State Government directives.
- Self Appraisal Reporting system and evaluation of faculty members before promotion from one academic grade pay/ post to higher academic grade pay/ post are followed as per the Department of Higher Education of Government of Tripura directives.
- IQAC encouraged faculties to participate in the orientation and refresher courses. They were also encouraged to participate in different international/national seminars/workshops. They were also encouraged to get training on internet and computers according to their requirement. Teachers were also encouraged to participate in different short term training programmes to improve their skill/knowledge.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Faculties as Assistant Professor are recruited through Tripura Public Service Commission following the UGC norms and the norms of the State Government. Faculties as Post Graduate Teacher are recruited by Department of Higher Education, Government of Tripura.
- Guest faculties are recruited by the College itself for an academic session as per norms forwarded by the Department of Higher Education.
- Administrative staff are recruited by the Department of Higher Education.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- The admission notification is issued centrally as advertisement in leading newspapers by the Department of Higher Education of the State Government. The annual Prospectus contains detailed information about the courses, intake of students, eligibility criteria, and process of admission. Admission to undergraduate programmes in the Faculties of Arts, Commerce and Science are made on the basis of H.S.(+2) or equivalent academic performance as per the norms set by Tripura University. Reservation policy of Government of Tripura is complied with, during the admission process.
- The selection of students to the institute is done through the Admission Committee through proper procedure of releasing merit lists (first, second and waiting list). Admission merit lists are uploaded in the College Website and published in the College Notice Board for transparency and for the convenience of students seeking

admission to the College.

Students' Feedback Analysis

Annexure 4.2

The College uses the manual feedback system for collecting students' responses under four headings: Teaching-Learning, Evaluation, Library and Administration. The responses of the batch 2014-15 are considered here. Filled in feedback forms are taken for analysis. Students simultaneously put their responses on the teaching-learning process, evaluation process, library services and administration friendly & hygienic services practiced/provided by the College.

The students are asked to put their responses against the options, 'Yes/Almost/Little/No' on ten simple questions regarding Teaching-Learning process based on which Teaching-Learning Composite Index (TLCI) is constructed. The students put their responses about evaluation process on three questions against the same options based on which Evaluation Composite Index (ECI) is constructed. They are asked to put their responses against the options, 'Regular/Occasionally/Never' on three simple questions regarding library services based on which Library Composite Index (LCI) is constructed and against the options, 'Yes/No' on five simple questions about administration, based on which Administration Composite Index (ACI) is constructed.

The students' responses are analysed by the IQAC Committee and it is monitored under the chairmanship of the Principal and feedback is discussed in the meeting of IQAC and Head of the Departments. The analysis is illustrated in the following table.

Best Practice-1

- 1. Title of the Practice: Learning Community Service through Voluntary Blood Donation
- 2. The Context: Blood cannot be manufactured by machines; it can only come from generous donors. India as well as the state of Tripura suffers from the problem of blood shortage. To mitigate this problem, the NSS unit and Students' Council of Ramthakur College regularly organise voluntary blood donation camps. It connects academic programme with community service. The community-based learning is not only a desirable supplement to the students traditional classroom learning but also develops a sense of social responsibility, tolerance and cooperation. It develops linkage between theory and practice, between knowledge and action and between resources of the institution and the community.
- Objectives of the Practice: The objectives of the practice are: (a) to involve students in social movements/activities which promote citizenship role and social networking skills; (b) to create linkage between institution of higher learning and community; (c) to mitigate the problem of blood shortage in the state of Tripura.
- 4. **The Practice**: The NSS Unit, NCC Unit and Students' Union Council of Ramthakur College organise voluntary blood donation camps every year with assistance from either the Blood Bank of Indira Gandhi Memorial Hospital or Gobinda Vallabh Pant Hospital, Tripura. A Doctor and three-to-five technical staff coordinate the blood camp. Doctor examines weight and primary health condition of each willing donor and technical staff collects blood from the donors. The collected blood is transported and stored in the Blood Bank. This practice is aimed at adequate supply of safe blood, and blood components, like blood group with contact number of the blood donors, are recorded for emergency need.


