# 2. Ramthakur College: A Brief History

Ramthakur College, an affiliated College of the Tripura University, is a coeducational institution and imparts teaching, learning and research in various subjects at undergraduate level.

It was a necessity – hundreds of students could not seek admission to the established colleges of Agartala and the influx was on. The man who derived inspiration in accepting the challenge was a "bare-footed half-clad ordinary employee of Agartala Municipality". He harped on the idea of coming out with a solution to the problem of the dearth of Colleges in Agartala. It was Late Pramod Ranjan Bhatta Chaudhuri who was determined to build up a college in the name of Sri Sri Ramthakur, a very popular Godhead of the then East Pakistan.

The College was established in the year 1967 by Late Pramod Ranjan Bhatta Chaudhuri at Town Pratapgarh in a six room structure with eight subjects in the Arts group and catered to the crying need of Higher Education by admitting all and sundry who could not procure a berth for himself or herself in the then degree college of Agartala. That was the beginning July the 17th, 1967 and then there was no looking back. Presently the college has Arts, Science and Commerce streams with approximately 5000 students. It caters to the aspirations and dreams of boys and girls of sub-urban areas of Agartala.

A. Vision of the College

The *vision* of Ramthakur College is to provide inclusive education and inculcating human values, professionalism and scientific temperament to all sections of students.

### 4. Admission process

As there is a paradigm shift from the existing course structure of TDP/TDPH to NEP-2020 from this year (2023-24), the following observations are very important -

- In NEP-2020, each and every student will have to take One Major subject, One Minor subject and one Interdisciplinary subjects along with Skill enhancement, value-added course, AECC etc.
- Students have the provision for subject UG Certificate after one year, UG Diploma after two years, UG Degree after three years and Honours/Research after four years.
- iii. Flexibility in multiple entry and exit option.

### 4.1 Eligibility

- i. Any student passing Higher Secondary/H.S.(+2)/ Senior Secondary examination or its equivalent from any recognized Board/Council (up to five years from the year of passing and the year of admission shall not be taken into account) shall be eligible for admission process conducted by Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Tripura to the 1st Semester of the Under Graduate (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com) Programme of studies subject to availability of seats.
- For B.Sc. Programmes, a candidate who has passed 10+2 with science or equivalent shall be eligible for admission.
- iii. A candidate opting Life Science subjects like Botany, Zoology, Human Physiology as Major Subject in the B.Sc. Programme must have studied Physics, Chemistry and Biology as perquisite subjects at the qualifying examination.
- iv. A candidate opting subjects like Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as Major Subject in the B.Sc. Programme must have studied Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as perquisite subjects at the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 or equivalent.
- v. For B.Com. Programme, a candidate with 10±2 commerce/Science shall be eligible for admission.

### 4.2 Subject Selection Procedure

- Major, Minor & Interdisciplinary subjects should not be the same.
- ii. A student can apply for maximum three subjects as Major in a particular college. Major subject will be allotted strictly on the basis of merit.
- iii. Students will mention 4 subjects as Minor in order of preference (mentioning 4 subjects as minor in the application form is mandatory for students applying for Arts and for Science & Commerce, it is two at least)

- iv. Students will mention 4 subjects for Interdisciplinary Course in order of preference (mentioning 4 subjects as minor in the application form is mandatory for students applying for Arts and for Science & Commerce it is two at least)
- v. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of sum of marks of Best Five subjects in H.S.(+2) Exam and the subject of party for Major.
  - a) If there is a tie in the sum, preference will be given on the marks obtained in the subject opted as Major.
  - b) If marks of the subject opted as Major is also equal, then the date of birth of the candidate will be considered and the senior will be given chance.
- vi. The merit list will be published for Major Subjects only.
- vii. Minor and Interdisciplinary subjects will be distributed among the students subject to availability of seat.
- viii. Reservation policy of Government of Tripura will be followed.

### 4.3 Application Form and required documents.

Admission Form and Prospectus will have to be collected from the College by paying a fees of Rs.30/-.

Along with the dully filled application form, the candidates are required to submit the self attested photo copies (one copy each) of the following documents:

- 1. Madhyamik Admit Card
- 2. Madhyamik Mark Sheet
- 3. H. S. (+2 Stage) Mark Sheet
- 4. Caste certificate for ST/SC students (essential for availing any quota)
- Aadhaar Card.
- School Leaving Certificate (original would be retained at the time of admission)
- 7. **3(Three) copies of recent photographs** (1 copy passport size photograph on the application form, 2 copies passport size photographs at the time of admission).
- 8. Migration Certificate (For the students other then TBSE/Foreign/National)
  All certificates in original are to be produced at the time of Form submission as well as at the time of admission for verification. Incomplete applications in any form or without the necessary documents as mentioned above shall be rejected.

### 6. General Provisions

- a. A student may be allowed to sit for any Semester Examination as a Non-Collegiate candidate, if he/she has attended minimum 65% of classes held in theory and practical separately in each Semester and on deposits of requisite amount of fees determined by the University from time to time.
- b. A student having attendance below 65% (65% Theoretical & 65% Practical classes) of the classes held in any Semester shall be declared as Dis-Collegiate and he/she shall not be allowed to appear at the End -Semester Examination and shall have to be readmitted.
- c. No student will be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination of the University if he/she fails to secure minimum 40% marks in the Internal Assessment portion.

### 8. Medium of Instruction

The deliberations in the classrooms may be conducted both in Bengali and English medium as per need. The candidates shall have the option for writing either in Bengali or English in Examinations conducted by the College as well as the Tripura (Central) University. However the question papers will be in English except in the language subjects.

### 9. Academic Guidelines

- 1. A student must come to college in prescribed **college-uniform** from the date of commencement of classes.
- 2. A student must wear his/her identity card.
- 3. The name of the students, who will keep himself /herself absent from the college for one month continuously, may be struck off the attendance register.
- 4. Mobile phones should be kept in silent/switch off mode in the classrooms. Mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the examination halls.
- 5. A student may contact to Head of the Department and Academic Section for educational guidance or assistance.
- 6. A student must join in co-curricular /extra-curricular activities of the institution.

### 10. Syllabi, Curriculum, Attendance and Examinassions

All syllabi, curriculum, attendance in classes and periodical examinations will be strictly as per rules and regulations of the Tripura University as per NEP-

2020(As per the notification 7-12-2022) to which the college is affiliated. Students are required to attain 95% attendance to get 5% marks in internal assessment.

### 11. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college encourages the students to join NSS and serve the nation building process and contribute to the holistic development of the society. The college also has a *Red Ribbon Club* that works under the NSS of the college unit in collaboration with the Tripura State Aids Control Society. The objective of this Club is to create awareness among the youths in particular and the masses in general about AIDS-HIV disease and to help it prevent from spreading.

The student volunteers from this college have taken part in the Republic day parade and won laurels for the institution. Several national programmes are organized in the college under the aegis of NSS to spread awareness among the student community in particular and the society in general. The interested students of the college are advised to contact the NSS Programme Officer of the College, Sri Shyamsundar Sarkar, Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy.

### 12. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

National Cadet Corps is also another youth organization of volunteers of Government of India with a glorious past of more than 70 years of existence. The College strives to inculcate moral values and patriotism among its students through such organizations. A total of 102 (Boys) and 48 (Girls) are enrolled for NCC under 13th Tripura BN and 15 Tripura (I) coy NCC unit in this college. They are also groomed for national duty and it's a matter of great pride for the college that a few cadets have participated in the national level camps like Basic Leadership camp, thal Sainik camp, National Integration camp, Pre-RDC camp, Army Attachment camp, Para-sailing camp, SSB courses, EBSB etc. A number of cadets from this college secured jobs in the military and Para-military forces every year. At present, Lieutenant Dr. Anamika Das is the programme officer of the female wing and Major Tarun Kumar Ghosh is the male wing.

### 13.Library

The college maintains a library with an impressive stock of books, which caters to the needs of all students. The library has reading room and computers with

internet connection facility. The college also subscribes to e-resources. The library activities and overall library development activities are being supervised by a library committee.

### 14. Games & Sports

Games and sports are important parts of our lives. Outdoor sports such as football, cricket, volleyball, hockey, athletics etc helps in improving physical health and mental fitness. However, some indoor games and sports like brain games, chess, Sudoku etc improves mental power and concentration level. There is a playground in the college campus for outdoor games and a gymnasium too, an indoor sports facility centre, for improving fitness level of the students. Students of our college are regularly participating in different inter-college and national level tournaments like cricket, football, yoga, athletics etc.

### 15. Discipline

Discipline is one of the major yardsticks by which an academic institution is measured and evaluated. The college expects good manners, sanctity, discipline and befitting decorum from students in and outside the college. Any student, who violates these sacred values and indulges in anti social, destructive and undesirable activities, is liable to be punished. With a view to maintaining proper discipline and combating any form of ragging inside the college, a discipline and an anti-ragging committee keeps round the clock vigil.

### 16.Dress Code

Like other general degree colleges of Tripura, this college also maintains a separate dress code for the students. But this year we have decided to change the Dress code and will be informed all the students about the Dress code during admission.

### 17. Teachers' Council

Teachers' Council is formed with all teachers of the college reflecting on the principles of participation in decision-making process in a democratic environment. All the teachers of the college are members of the council. Principal of the college is the Ex-officio President of the council. The council elects the Secretary and various Conveners /members and forms other important committees like Placement Cell, Cultural Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell etc in the annual general meeting of the

## 18. Right to information (RTI) Cell

The Right to Information Act was enacted in 2005 with the objective of ensuring and promoting transparency and accountability in the working of government institutions. It mandates timely response to the requests of citizen/stakeholders for government information. There is a RTI Cell in this institution where the Principal is the SPIO.

### 19. Anti -Ragging Cell

The college has an anti-ragging cell headed by one Assistant Professor with three other faculties, who can be contacted privately for any inconvenience in the college campus. ### 20. Administration

Being a government college, the whole administration is run following rules and regulations policy and decisions adopted by Government of Tripura from time to time. Overall management and administration of the college is under the direct control and supervision of the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Tripura. At the College level, the Principal is academic and administrative head and everything is under the supervision and control of the Principal, who is accountable to the Directorate of Higher Education. The Principal is immensely supported by the DDO, Secretary Teachers' Council and various sub-committees headed by a Teacher as convener with other teachers as members. There are a few sections in the office which help the overall administration, viz. Academic, Establishment, Stipend, Accounts, Store, Cash section etc.

Students willing to pursue Physical Science/Biological Science are advice to take related subjects as their minor subjects. For commerce students, they are advice to opt for either Group-I or Group-II as minor subjects.

# 22. AWARDING OF CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA AND DEGREE

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 122 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as per NEP-2020 Regulations by Tripura University.

4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme 13 with 162 credits and have satisfyed the credit requirements as per NEP-2020 Regulations by Tripura University.

**4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):** Students who secure 7.5 CGPA and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 162 credits, including 12 credits from a research project / dissertation, are awarded UG Degree Honours with Research.


