- **Font Size:** Times New Roman 11 with bold headings; Line Spacing: 1.15 justified
- **Reference:** APA style
- **Submission:** The abstract and manuscript submission should reach at the email address in due time.
- **Tables & Diagrams:** Number of tables and diagrams in the paper (if used) should not be more than five.
